
### Supplementary Education for Participating Clinics

#### Introduction to Health Equity:

This free, online course from the National Collaborating Centre for Determinants of Health aims to “develop the knowledge, skills and competencies to support action on health equity.” We suggest completing *Module 1: What are Health Inequities* and *Module 2: Pathways to Health Equity*, to gain a better understanding of the social determinants of health. It shouldn't take longer than 45-60 minutes to complete both modules.
